



GLOBAL CRISIS DEEPENS

Description

Prolonged conflict, mass displacement, and the collapse of essential infrastructure have created an acute humanitarian crisis in Gaza. Safe, sustained aid access and civilian security guarantees are urgently needed, alongside robust ceasefire monitoring. Recurrent violence and political deadlock continue to destabilize not just Gaza but the broader Middle East. As a key power, the U.S. plays a pivotal role in diplomacy, humanitarian support, and reconstruction. Lasting peace demands a shift from temporary truces to a comprehensive plan addressing both immediate relief and the root causes of the conflict.

Description


India's approach to Pakistan stands at a strategic crossroads, balancing counterterrorism imperatives with the need to avoid escalation. Cross-border attacks—like Pahalgam, Uri, and Pulwama—underscore the urgency of a firm counterterror framework focused on deterrence, rapid response, and secure borders. Yet, the sustainability of militarized engagement remains contested amid calls for diplomatic recalibration.

Pakistan's internal volatility, shifting alliances, and global dynamics complicate India's policy options. Navigating this landscape demands a strategy that neutralizes non-state threats, safeguards sovereignty, and leverages global partnerships to explore pathways to peace without compromising national interests.

Description

Escalating U.S.-China tensions, EU protectionism, and retaliatory actions by emerging economies have destabilized global trade, fragmenting supply chains and dampening investment. Tariffs on semiconductors and EVs, export curbs on critical minerals, and mechanisms like the EU's carbon border tax have triggered policy backlash worldwide.

Developing regions—especially South Asia and Sub-Saharan Africa—face trade shocks, inflation, and reduced capital flows. As trust in multilateral frameworks like the WTO erodes, trade wars are evolving into tools of geopolitical leverage. Stabilizing global trade demands renewed commitment to dispute resolution, inclusive dialogue, and reforms in trade governance.

IRAQ UNDER FIRE

Description

At 05:00 hrs on 20 March 2003, U.S.-led coalition forces launched Operation Iraqi Freedom, initiating targeted strikes based on contested claims of WMDs and terror links. The invasion led to the fall of the Ba'athist regime but triggered a prolonged crisis marked by insurgency, sectarian conflict, and the rise of ISIS.

Post-invasion governance failures, fractured security, and humanitarian collapse entrenched instability and drew in global powers. Civilian suffering, displacement, and urban devastation reshaped Iraq's socio-political fabric. This moment remains a pivotal freeze point—one that continues to shape international security, diplomacy, and debates on military intervention.

and Resource & Exploitation.**

POLES IN PERIL

Description

The Arctic and Antarctic face mounting environmental and strategic pressures. Melting ice has unlocked Arctic maritime routes like the Northern Sea Route, triggering Russian militarisation, U.S. naval activity, and China's Polar Silk Road ambitions. Resource extraction in fragile ecosystems further escalates the risks.

In Antarctica, despite the 1959 Treaty's demilitarised framework, expanding infrastructure by key powers—under scientific pretexts—raises alarms over dual-use intent. Urgent global action is needed to enforce treaties, halt militarisation and drilling, and reaffirm these polar regions as protected commons vital to climate stability and international peace.

Deliberation over human rights for LGBTQIA+ Communities in Conservative Nations with special emphasis on Islamic Communities.



RIGHTS OR RULES?

Description

Across many conservative and Islamic states, LGBTQIA+ individuals face systemic criminalisation, persecution, and denial of basic civil rights. In Iran and Saudi Arabia, same-sex relations are met with extreme penalties, including death, while Pakistan's outdated laws continue to criminalise queer identities despite limited trans recognition. State-driven repression, censorship, and lack of access to justice, healthcare, and public services create unsafe, often life-threatening conditions, forcing many into silence or exile.

This agenda examines the tension between religious conservatism and universal human rights, highlighting the role of grassroots reform, international legal frameworks, and diplomatic engagement in advancing decriminalisation and protection for LGBTQIA+ communities.

ECHOES BEHIND THE VEIL

Description

Since the Taliban's return in August 2021, Afghanistan has witnessed a sharp erosion of human rights—particularly for women, girls, minorities, and civil society actors. Bans on female education, mobility, and public participation, along with persecution of Hazaras, Sikhs, Shia Muslims, and former officials, reflect systemic repression and impunity.

With democratic institutions dismantled and legal accountability absent, international mechanisms under the Responsibility to Protect (R2P) are critical. Strengthening fact-finding missions, sanctions, and ICC referrals is essential to uphold justice. A coordinated global response—led by the UN, regional actors, and civil society—is vital to prevent further normalization of authoritarian abuses.

MULTIVERSE IN DANGER?

Description

Amid rumors of Tony Stark's re-emergence following his presumed death during the Battle of Earth, unexplained Stark-Tech activity in restricted zones has alarmed global intelligence networks and former Avengers operatives.

His alleged return raises critical concerns over identity, bioengineering, and the ethical limits of post-human technologies. The weaponization of AI and unauthorized replication of Stark's legacy threaten to destabilize global alliances and escalate arms races.

With S.W.O.R.D., Wakandan scientists, and ex-Stark Industries personnel investigating Project RESURRECT, the world stands at a crossroads—between innovation and extinction, legacy and liability, man and machine.
